

- Outside recognition for the club's work input on projects




Action team


Backup to team work

Action team - more detail

- evaluate our fund raising efforts last year and year before
- what went well
- what did not work so well
- what shall we do this year, this autumn and next year spring term
- what goals do you set
- how shall we evaluate which project to invest in
- how could we work to increase our fund raising effort with for example other Rotary Clubs or....
- local projects (in Oslo area) versus overseas projects- which or both
- how do we address the following?
- When I asked the club members earlier this year what would inspire them that we could do in the club, there were several that replied they wanted to do/have more local project(s) ie Oslo area and also wanted to get more recognition for the work put into the fund raising and project(s).
- We have limited funds as the proposed budget showed that was sent out earlier (24/6). It shows a
 loss at last years fund raising effort if we plan for 10 000 for local projects and 35 000 for our
 students in Bangladesh.

New Rotarians team more detail

- what social life do you wish or foresee in the club in the coming year, eg a regular predictable weekly rotation or whatever: 1st Wednesday of the month -club social with meal; 2nd wednesday - visit other club; 3rd wednesday - club social visit somewhere in Oslo; 4th Wednesday - speaker/ presentation in the club
- what interesting / engaging topics or presentations could we have in the club
- what format speaker presentations eg full 45 mins + questions format or for example a 20min short presentation followed by a debate (possibly with pros and cons prepared arguments, ie on a topic that is announced beforehand) or some other format
- new members where and how do we find them; where is our market; how do we approach the market?
- we are selling a product called Rotary (4 way test, projects, service above self etc) to that market - how shall we do that?
 - our RI president Barry Rassin has set Rotary the motto "be the inspiration"
 - $% \left({{\rm{well}}}\right)$ well what would inspire the club members, then presumably we could inspire new members
 - what would inspire younger people to come to Rotary meetings
 - RI president Barry Rassin wants "RI to double the number of Rotary clubs sponsoring Rotaract clubs" - what could we do?
 - "make sure every Rotaract club is fully embraced by Rotary" " by building Rotaract clubs that are community based" - is that something we could have a shot at?
